Elections will be conducted at the May 17th AGM, according to the BCRPVPA format as indicated on the bcrpvpa.ca website, under the caption CONSTITUTION, Article 9.

ARTICLE 9 OFFICERS and EXECUTIVE MEMBERS (as per the BCRPVPA Constitution)

- 9.1) Officers of this Association shall be the President, the Past President, Vice-President, the Secretary, and the Treasurer.
 - 9.2) The Executive Committee of the Association shall consist of the President, Past President, V-P, Secretary, Treasurer and 5 to 9 Members-at-Large.
 - 9.3) Unless elected by acclamation, the members of the Executive Committee of the Association shall be elected by secret ballot at an Annual General Meeting with nominations being accepted from the floor.
- 9.4) If for any reason a vacancy occurs in the membership of the Executive Committee,

the President, acting on the advice of the remaining members of the Executive

Committee, may appoint a Member to fill the vacancy until the next Annual General Meeting.

MEMBERS-at-LARGE shall: (as per the Constitution & revised 2021 Bylaws)

The Members-at-Large shall:

serve and assume various responsibilities within the Communications Committee and/or the Member Services Committee to assist the executive committee.

Areas of responsibility of the Communications Committee include Technology, Website, Newsletter, Yammer, Mail-outs, Mentorship, and Surveys.

Areas of responsibility of the Members Services Committee include Membership, Sunshine, Speakers, Affinity. Scholarship, and Pensions. Each area of responsibility will have several Members-at-Large serving it and the lead individual will change yearly to promote knowledge of the Association and succession.

Chapter Council Report, Feb 10th & 11th, 2023

The main focus of this CC Meeting was on what is being carried out at the Ministry of Education level and at the school level to combat anti-racism in the school system.

There was a very well-prepared session about the Métis Nation presented by two educators from the Métis Nation.

Each person present was a recipient of a book about the Métis.

There was also information of participation in the FINESC Conference (First Nations Education Steering Committee).

There were also reports in the area of anti-racism from the Minister of Education & Child Care (Hon, Racha Singh), from the Assistant Deputy Minister, System Liaison and Supports Division (Jennifer McCrea MOE), from the Director of Workplace Development (Linda Beddouche, MOE), and from the Senior Manager, Strategic Talent Acquisition (Andrew Jang BCPSEA).

It was pointed out that each School District is asked to include a section on anti-racism on its website.

It is worthy of note that Brian Leonard, the President of the BCPVPA addressed the CC on an ongoing basis and that Mike Roberts is currently acting as Executive Director of the BCPVPA.

Scholarships 2022

Grace (\$1000 student scholarship recipient 2022)

Scholarship winner Grace is a well-rounded individual with an impeccable student record, achieving 97% in her core studies in French Immersion. She has sought out volunteer service opportunities at school and in her community and has been recognized for her leadership in her school district.

Grace volunteers weekly at extended care homes, spending time visiting and helping the residents. These activities have nurtured her interest in a career in the Healthcare System as she moves into post-secondary education.

In addition to her participation is school clubs such as Students for Change, Grace's passion for French Immersion learning has led her to participate in supporting potential candidates for continuing their immersion studies in high school. She has volunteered as a mentor and sponsor for new students providing coaching and orientation for incoming French Immersion students.

Grace was recruited at the district level for Destination Imagination BC to lead her own school team. Destination Imagination is an educational-based creative problem-solving program designed to encourage participants to work collaboratively to solve challenges and is committed to inspiring Innovation and Leadership among participants. She has represented her School District in the Destination Imagination tournament for the last two years.
